Barrier-Free Theatre returns to Monon Community Center

"We are so fortunate to have a community who loves this program and helps it thrive," said Sarah Fenster, CCPR Barrier-Free Theatre director.

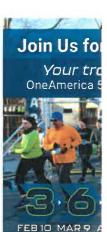
"We've also developed new ways to involve folks who are interested in the program, from stage crew to set painting to ushering and even directing

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CCPR will present its sixth annual Barrier-Free Theatre performance in honor of Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month in March. This year's performance, "Mystery at the Rider Mansion," will be at the Monon Community Center at 6 p.m. March 16 and at 2 p.m. March 17. An American Sign Language interpreter will be provided for the March 16 performance.

Barrier-Free Theatre is a form of drama therapy that empowers individuals with and without disabilities to create and perform original stories together. The entire creative process takes about eight months to complete.

"The participants love the social aspects of rehearsals as much as they love the performance aspect," Fenster said. "They enjoy collaborating to build a story, dreaming up characters that inspire and challenge them and feeling their hard work pay off when they perform in front of family, friends and community members. We also have a lot of fun bonding as a cast, playing theater games and celebrating our hard work."

There are two directors, 20 participants and five volunteers. The plot of "The Mystery at the Rider Mansion" revolves around deep-seated jealousy and family conflict.

Fenster has been involved in the CCPR Barrier-Free program since 2019.

"The directors lead the cast through brainstorming, improvisation and voting that helps us select themes and ideas for the show," Fenster said. "As a cast we build the performance one element at a time, with the participants sharing ideas and shaping the performance while the directors are there to help them narrow down ideas and put the pieces together. The script is written by the directors with the participants' ideas and voices in mind, each role is built for the individual actor playing it."

Tickets are \$12 and are available for purchase online or in person at the Monon Community Center.

White River Greenway north extension project soon underway

On or after Monday, March 11, work will begin on the White River Greenway north extension project in Carmel. During construction, the greenway will remain open; however, trail users should be mindful of construction work and any posted signage.

The project includes extending the greenway north to 146th Street as well as the construction of a river overlook, parking lot and year-round restrooms. Once complete, the White River Greenway will span over five miles in Carmel. The project is in partnership with Conner Prairie and is part of a regional effort to expand the greenway and turn attention toward the area's most significant natural resource: the White River.

Improvements are funded by a \$4 million Regional Economic Acceleration and Development Initiative (READI) grant as well as by the Park Board with over \$1 million in park and recreation impact fees. The READI grant, provided by the Indiana Economic Development Corporation through the Central Indiana Regional Development Authority, was awarded in 2022 to support expanding the greenway.

Trails and connectivity contribute to ecological, economic and health benefits in the community. The trail extension supports Carmel Clay Parks & Recreation's goal to embrace the White River as outlined in the 2020-2024 Comprehensive Park and Recreation Master Plan.

Proposal would put Carmel City Council in control of park impact fees

Carmel's Midtown was the place to be recently on an unseasonably warm late-winter afternoon.

Walkers, runners and bikers took to the Monon Greenway, while ping-pong players and loungers headed to Monon Plaza.

The city's downtown parks over the past decade have become some of its most notable and popular features. They're among some 700 acres of land in Carmel dedicated to parks, large and small.

But a funding stream Carmel uses to develop parks has become a source of tension among officials and even the subject of a recently dismissed lawsuit. Now, the Carmel City Council is considering stepping in to oversee how those funds are spent.

Park impact fees are charged to developers and used to support park construction.

But the city has routinely waived the park impact fee, allowing developers to instead pay a credit to the Carmel Redevelopment Commission, which has spent the funds developing plazas and green space in the city's urban core.

Carmel charges developers \$4.882 per dwelling unit in park impact fees, the most in Hamilton County; a 250-unit apartment building would result in more than \$1.2 million for park construction and maintenance. By comparison, Fishers charges developers \$3,513 per single-family dwelling and \$2,108 per multifamily unit.

"The goal [of park impact fees] is to ensure that, as we expand and grow and as we have more people, that we've got the amenities necessary for them to live in the best place they can," Carmel City Council member Ryan Locke said.

The Legislature established park impact fees in 1996 as an alternative funding mechanism to pay for park improvements in fast-growing areas.

Since 1996, Carmel has increased in physical size through 56 annexations and in Rvan Locke population from around 30,000 residents to more than 100,000. Downtown has experienced rapid redevelopment, and farm fields formerly in Clay Township have been transformed into Carmel neighborhoods.

Source of tension

Park impact fee credits are sometimes used as a negotiating chip by the Carmel Redevelopment Commission when it works with developers on major downtown public-private projects.

That practice, however, has created tension between the CRC and Carmel Clay Parks & Recreation, which wants park spending more evenly distributed citywide. The parks department in December filed a lawsuit against the city, and the Carmel City Council is now looking to step in and be the arbiter of how park impact fees are used and whether developers should be granted the credit.

"I am very disappointed that two government entities—who have been partners for over 30 years—that one felt the need to sue the other," Carmel City Council member Jeff Worrell said.

Parks department officials argued in the lawsuit that the city inappropriately diverted millions of dollars through park impact fee credits to the CRC to be used in small spaces in the urban core to the detriment of larger, traditional parks throughout the city.

IBJ counted at least nine instances last November and December when a credit was granted to a developer.

Before 2010, Carmel Clay Parks & Recreation was the only entity that could grant impact fee credits. The Carmel City Council that year expanded the right to the Carmel Board of Public Works, an entity composed of the mayor and two people appointed by the mayor.

Over the past decade, the Board of Public Works granted more than \$25 million in park impact fee credits. Approximately \$6.2 million of that was granted for three projects late last year during former Mayor Jim Brainard's final weeks in office. Another six projects also received credits, but those amounts have yet to be defined because the number of units in the buildings has not been set.

Brainard told IBJ in December before he left office that the Carmel Redevelopment Commission has spent \$50 million on downtown parks, and a fraction of that has come from park impact fees. He argued that money coming from downtown development and public-private partnerships should be spent where it is generated and not in suburban areas of Carmel.

The city's downtown parks include Midtown Plaza, Carter Green, Monon Boulevard and Monon Greenway, the Kawachinagano Japanese Garden and Freedom Circle Veterans Memorial.

CRC Director Henry Mestetsky has said publicly that waiving park impact fees is a negotiating tool that helps seal major public-private deals.

He told IBJ that green space is sometimes the centerpiece of a project, such as at a \$700 million development at East 111th Street and North Pennsylvania Avenue by Carmel-based Pedcor Community Development Corp. that is slated to include 912 multifamily units, 58 for-sale town houses, 430,000 square feet of retail and office space, two public parking garages, and a public park/plaza.



"The central core needs as much parks infrastructure as in the suburbs," Mestetsky said. "It's just a different kind of parks infrastructure."

But Carmel Clay Parks & Recreation officials said in the lawsuit that the practice has resulted in construction delays because of a lack of funds, particularly at the future Bear Creek Park near West 146th Street and Shelbourne Road. Bear Creek Park is one of three projects on which Parks & Recreation is spending park impact fee funds. The others are West Park and an acquisition and development along the White River corridor.

Carmel Clay Parks & Recreation also receives some funding from the city, but it is a separate entity created in 1991 by an interlocal agreement between the city and Clay Township, and it does not answer to the Mayor's Office.

On Tuesday, the Carmel Clay Board of Parks & Recreation voted to call off the lawsuit because it said in a statement that Finkam and the City Council are committed to enhancing "transparency regarding the issuance of impact fee credits."

"This is an issue we are happy to move beyond," Carmel Clay Parks & Recreation Director Michael Klitzing said in written remarks.

Should the City Council approve a proposed change to the process, the Board of Works would no longer have the authority to grant credits. Instead, the credit would first be heard by the plan commission and ultimately approved by the City Council.

The City Council would also oversee all park impact fee spending. If Carmel Clay Parks & Recreation or the Carmel Redevelopment Commission wants to use park impact fees to fund a project, the directors would be required to first meet to discuss their needs and then approach the City Council for approval.

"The first question we would ask to either of them would be, 'Have you talked to the other one?' to really spur collaboration," Carmel City Council member Matthew Snyder said.

Worrell said the current system of using the Carmel Board of Public Works worked for a time, but "things change."

"I think getting the City Council [involved], which is a body that's elected by the people and has to answer to the voters, I think that is ultimately a good thing," Worrell said. "So, to me, this is more of an evolution than righting a wrong."



Mestetsky said the move would ensure transparency and more cooperation between parks and redevelopment.

"At the same time, it recognizes that you need all the tools and arrows in the quiver," he said. "You need all the tools in the tool chest to be able to put together public-private partnerships."

Klitzing agreed.

"The important component of what's being proposed is that it increases significantly the transparency for everything that has to do with impact fees, which in my perspective, is a good thing," he said. "I think that's something that we can all rally around."

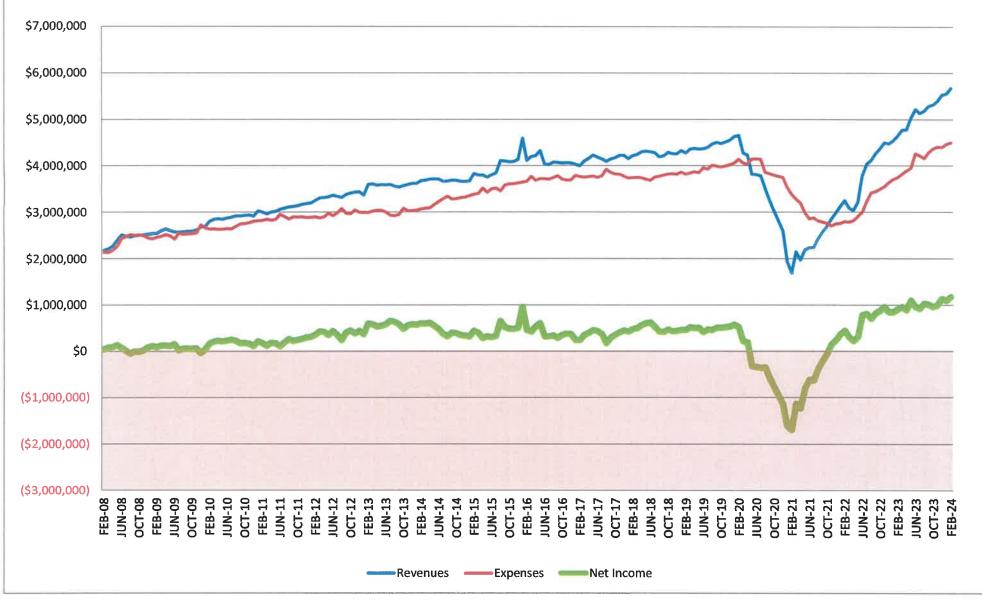
The Carmel Plan Commission is reviewing language for the proposed amendment to the city's unified development ordinance. The commission will likely hold a public hearing in April and vote on a recommendation. The amendment would next go to the City Council for approval.

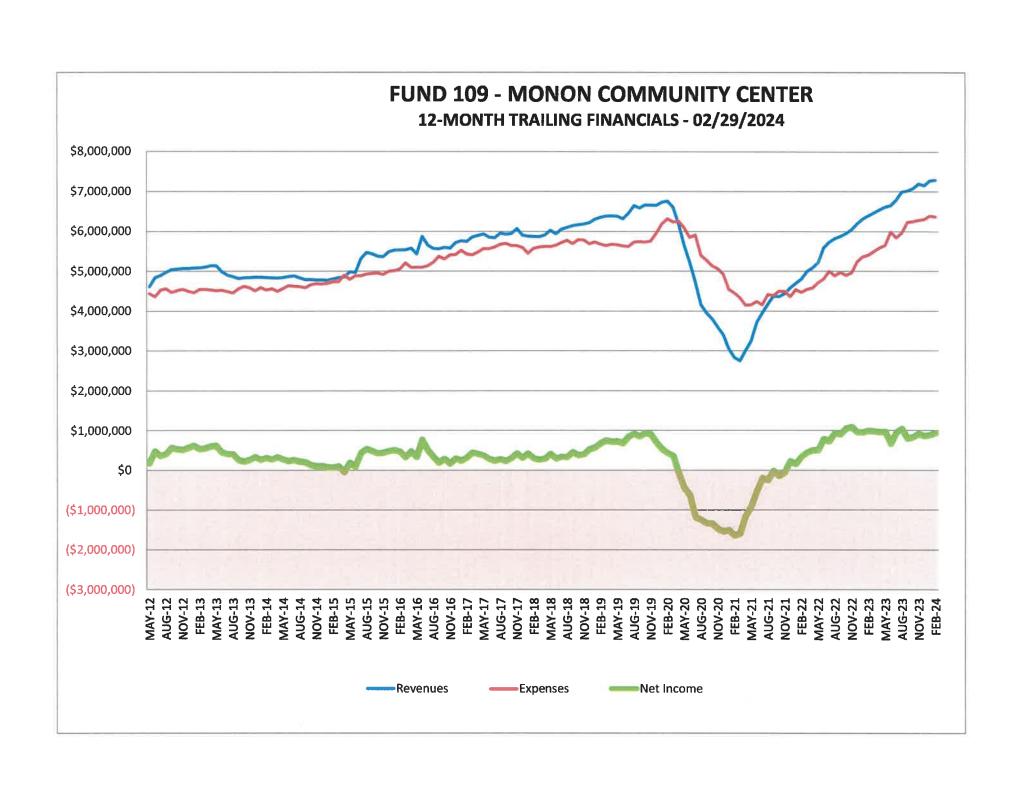
Locke said he believes there is consensus among City Council members that the change is necessary and would give the City Council the authority to be a fiduciary check and balance.

"The goal is to open the process to create transparency to help foster collaboration," he said. "I think this issue just has become one of those things that needs one more step in it."•

Board of Parks and Recreation Lawsuit against the City of Carmel

Board Vice President Kristunas requested guidance from legal council on whether the Board should hear an update from legal first or allow Mr. Garretson to start with why he requested the agenda item to be added.

Mr. Bosma decided to start with providing an update on the lawsuit for everyone to consider throughout their discussion. This update included the history and current status of the lawsuit.

Mr. Westermeier asked for further explanation on the extensions granted to the City to help hold off further legal fees, to which Mr. Bosma explained the extensions have been more in the hopes that policy makers would come together to negotiate and come to mutual terms without formal mediation.

Mr. Westermeier expressed that to his knowledge no such meetings or discussions have occurred, to which Mr. Bosma explained the current status of the ordinance drafted and in progress by the Common Council to help address the issues of where and how the Impact Fee program is managed moving forward.

Mr. Garretson expressed his feelings toward trusting in the recently elected Common Council members who are known supporters of the Parks Department. Adding his concerns over securing a solution to the upcoming end of the Interlocal Agreement between the City and Clay Township.

Mr. Garretson made a motion to dismiss the lawsuit in a manner that allows one to be filed again in the future if necessary.

Board Vice President Kristunas requested Director Klitzing to further clarify the effects of the potential ending of the Interlocal Agreement and to provide his opinions on the lawsuit from the perspective of the Director.

Director Klitzing gave an overview on the history of the amendments made to the Interlocal Agreement over the year. He further explained that the moment the Central Park bonds are paid off (*January 15, 2025*), the Interlocal agreement reverts back to the original baseline agreement which would turn the Board back into an 11-member board with one appointee from the School Board and the remaining 10 from the Mayor's Office since they would be providing all funding for the general fund operations. In order to fully dissolve the agreement, either the City or Township would have to initiate that change by June of the year prior to making it effective in January.

Director Klitzing proceeded to give an overview of his position on the lawsuit and the challenges he is facing having conversations and making arrangements while this lawsuit persists. He is also looking favorably towards the actions already taken by Common Council which shows promise. Agreeing with Mr. Westermeier's points that it is not a complete "win."

Ms. Zheng asked if this lawsuit is dismissed, can it be brought back up again in the future, to which Mr. Bosma explained that it is all dependent on the nature of dismissal (with or without prejudice).

Board Vice President Kristunas recognized Mr. Kirsh being virtual and gave him an opportunity to speak on his opinions. Mr. Kirsh expressed his support for moving forward with the dismissal.

Ms. Browning noted that the original motion mentioned "dismissal" versus Director Klitzing who mentioned "defer" and wanted to clarify between the two. Mr. Bosma stepped in to explain the two possible actions to be taken.

- 1. Dismissal with the preference of no designation and leaving that negotiation to the President and Executive Director to finalize.
- 2. Continue (defer) and issue another continuance to allow for more discussion between parties.

The original motion was reiterated and added that Mr. Garretson was not asking for the dismissal to be identified as with or without prejudice at this time. The motion was seconded by Mr. Rude.

It was recommended that Board Vice President Kristunas ask for any additional comments or questions prior to the vote.

Mr. Westermeier wanted to state that the current Mayor was also a member of the previous Council that voted to approve BPW's (*Board of Public Works*) ability to take these funds away from Parks.

- Finalized the Albany Village closing.
- Finalized the CTI amendment agreement.

Director's Report

Director Klitzing provided an update on current projects including the closure of Hazel Landing Park for the construction of the 106th Pedestrian Bridge.

2024 budget update – City is only releasing \$519k of the original \$2m requested within the Parks Capital Fund (103) which will allow us to start projects other than the planned first phase of the Chinese Garden.

Continuing to make progress on the Comprehensive Park and Recreation Master Plan.

Working with Bakertilly and PROS Consulting to draft the Zone Improvement Plan. This includes recommendations for changes to Impact Fee amounts.

Provided update on the Department's plans for the Eclipse on April 8th.

Director Klitzing had a positive conversation with Harvest Church, which neighbors Thomas Marcuccilli Nature Park (TMNP), and has submitted plans for their expansion which includes additional parking to the south. They have purposefully left space within that plan available for additional partnership conversations with CCPR related to accessing TMNP.

The White River North Extension is getting underway. Conner Prairie needs to change the trail layout slightly due to some potential archaeological significance in the site area. This benefits parks by pushing the trail closer to the river for an additional portion as well as pulling the trail further away from River Road on the northern most section.

Mr. Westermeier asked if we have an expected number of visitors on the Eclipse Day. Assistant Director Baumgartner gave an overview of planning efforts to prepare for the event. Assistant Director Baumgartner and Ms. Browning indicated that ticket sales around the area should increase if the predictions are good once the 10-day forecast is available.

SUMMARY:

In 1991, the Indiana General Assembly passed legislation creating an alternative funding mechanism for local infrastructure improvements in fast growing areas. As established in IC 36-7-4-1300 et seq., the Impact Fees Law allows units of local government the option of passing onto new residents the costs of building new infrastructure expected by and required to support those same residents. This helps maintain quality of life as the community grows, while also ensuring existing residents do not bear the financial burden of the population growth. Impact fees may be assessed for park and recreation facilities, roads and bridges, drainage and flood control, and water and sanitary utilities.

The City Council first authorized the Park and Recreation Impact Fee in 1996 through adoption of Ordinance D-1249-96. As required by state statute, the impact fee has been reauthorized five times since its original adoption, most recently on November 18, 2019, through Ordinance Z-644-19. Carmel has chosen to only charge impact fees to support new parks and recreation infrastructure for the community.

The impact fee is formally established through the Zone Improvement Plan (ZIP), which is prepared by CCPR in coordination with the Department of Community Services (DOCS), reviewed and approved by the Carmel Plan Commission, which also serves as the Impact Fee Advisory Committee, and adopted by the Council through an ordinance. There is a minimum 6-month waiting period before the rate established within a newly adopted zone improvement plan goes into effect. Plans must be updated at least once every five years per state statute. A new ordinance must be adopted by or before December 1, 2024, to ensure no lapse in the impact fee, which would be detrimental to park capital funding, especially given the pending loss of Local Income Taxes received from Clay Township.

The impact fee is calculated based on a state-mandated formula that factors in park infrastructure needed to serve new residents, a 10-year projection of new housing units, the new residents' estimated share of principle payments for outstanding and proposed bonds for park infrastructure, and other projected capital funding sources. This calculation is referred to by state statute as the Community Level of Service. Based on the calculations in the draft 2024-2029 Zone Improvement Plan, the impact fee could be up to \$8,276 per residential dwelling unit, which represents an increase of 70% from the current rate of \$4,882.

Under no circumstances may the impact fee exceed what Indiana law refers to as the Current Level of Service. This effective cap is calculated based on the current asset value of the park and recreation system (land and improvements) divided by the total housing units in the community at the time the zone improvement plan is prepared. The Current Level of Service in Carmel is \$9,401.

It is important to note that both the Current and Community Levels of Service could have been higher than specified in the proposed ZIP. The existing asset value includes only park and recreation assets directly owned and/or managed by CCPR. City-owned and managed assets, such as Brookshire Golf Club and Carter Green, were not factored into the calculations and would have increased the Current Level of Service. Additional capital projects to serve new residents could have easily been identified and included in the ZIP, which would have increased the Community Level of Service and resulted in a higher permissible impact fee.

The current rate of \$4,882 represented a 64% increase from the previous impact fee of \$2,972. Developers can request an early assessment, which occurred for 2,904 potential units at the time of the last rate increase. To help mitigate against similar efforts to lock in a lower rate, CCPR has recommended returning to a phased rate increase as was used for the 2010-2015 and 2015-2020 plans. As proposed, the rate would increase 10% annually, with the first rate increase beginning effective the first day of the month following the 6-month mandatory waiting period (anticipated to be January 1, 2025). Following is a summary of the recommended rates:

Current Rate	\$4,882
1/1/2025 - 12/31/2025	\$5,370

1/1/2027 - 12/31/2027	\$6,498
1/1/2028 - 12/31/2028	\$7,148

The impact fee applies to all new residential development within the City of Carmel. The fee is assessed and collected by DOCS for every new residential dwelling unit at the time a construction permit is issued, with funds deposited into a designated fund. For multifamily housing, the impact fee is collected for each unit in the building. (For example, the total fee for a 100-unit apartment complex = 100 x impact fee rate.) Fees are not charged for residential remodels or commercial developments of any type. Since most single and multifamily residences are built as part of a larger development, this fee is typically paid by the developer and factored into the sale price or rental fee as one of the many costs of construction.

Indiana law limits the use of impact fees for new capital projects solely within the parks or designated areas specifically identified in the ZIP. As proposed, this will include:

- West Park: Continued implementation of the 2016 West Park Master Plan, including phase 2 development of the westernmost portion of the park referred to as The Groves
- Bear Creek Park: Implementation of the 2022 Bear Creek Park Master Pla, including playground, splash pad, trails, shelters, program pavilion, and more.

- White River Corridor: Acquisition and development of parkland along or near the White River, including southern expansion of the White River Greenway.
- Thomas Marcuccilli Nature Park: Implementation of the 2023 Thomas Marcuccilli Nature Park Master Plan, including trails, boardwalks, restrooms, and parking.
- Central Core: Acquisition and development of parkland within the central portion of the community.
- Chinese Garden: Implementation of the 2023 Chinese Garden Master Plan within the central core of the community.
- Japanese Garden: Continued expansion of the existing Japanese Garden south of City Hall based on 2023 plans prepared for Clay Township by Kurisu LLC.

These projects have been identified as needs as CCPR finalizes the new 2024-2029 Comprehensive Parks and Recreation Master Plan, is being developed concurrently with the new ZIP. This master plan process has incorporated significant public input, including a statistically valid community survey.

Provided for your review is the current draft of the proposed 2024-2029 Zone Improvement Plan. The Impact Fee Advisory Committee is meeting on April 9, 2024, at 6 pm to review the proposed ZIP. This meeting will be held in the CPD Training Room, #110, 1st Floor, Carmel City Court Building, 1000 S Rangeline Rd, Carmel, IN 46032. The Plan Commission will hold a public hearing on the ZIP at its regular meeting on April 16, 2024, at 6 pm in the Council Chambers at City Hall. The timeline on Council action will be based on when the Plan Commission takes action on the proposed ZIP, which may occur at the April 16th meeting to deferred to a later meeting.

2025-2029 ZONE IMPROVEMENT PLAN CITY OF CARMEL, INDIANA FOR THE CARMEL CLAY PARK AND RECREATION SYSTEM

INTRODUCTION AND GENERAL COMMENTS

The City of Carmel, Indiana adopted a recreation impact fee (the "2019 Impact Fee") with Ordinance PRIF Z-644-19 (the "2019 PRIF Ordinance"), based on the 2020-2025 Zone Improvement Plan (the "2020-2025 ZIP") and pursuant to IC 36-7-4-1300 through IC 36-7-4-1342 (the "Enabling Legislation"). The 2019 PRIF Ordinance established the 2019 Impact Fee at an amount of \$4,882 per housing unit, effective November 18, 2019. The 2019 Impact Fee is collected at the time of the City's issuance of a building permit.

The 2019 PRIF Ordinance, per the Enabling Legislation, expires five years after its effective date and gives to the Common Council of the City (the "Council") the power to consider economic and market forces over which it has no control, to cause a review of the validity of the impact fee, the impact zone and the zone improvement plan. Based on such a review, the Council has the power to adopt such amendments as are necessary to cause a substantive compliance with all constitutional and statutory requirements. Accordingly, the City is interested in updating the 2019 PRIF Ordinance as allowed by the Enabling Legislation.

This report serves as a Zone Improvement Plan (herein referred to as the "ZIP" and in the adopting Ordinance as the "2025-2029 Zone Improvement Plan"), in compliance with the Enabling Legislation. As such, it provides a foundation for imposing impact fees on future development to offset additional costs for park system expansion and improvements.

Impact Fees

Impact fees, as described by this ZIP, will shift the cost of new and expanded park facilities from the community at large to the new development that is generating the need for those new and expanded facilities. Impact fees, however, cannot be used to finance improvements to overcome existing deficiencies in park facilities, nor can they be used to fund maintenance or operations.

Impact Zone

For the purposes of this ZIP, the Impact Zone is defined as the corporate limits of the City of Carmel. Maps of the Impact Zone are attached as **Appendix A**.

ZIP Approval Process

The following is the approval process through which the prior zone improvement plans and through which this ZIP proceeded to become official documents of the Carmel Community (the "Community"):

- Review by the City's Impact Fee Advisory Committee, which is composed of members of the Carmel Plan Commission (see IC 36-7-4-1312, "the IFAC");
- Public hearing and recommendation by the Carmel Plan Commission, the "CPC"; and
- Approval by the Common Council of the City of Carmel, the "Council" (see IC 36-7-4-1311).

Approval by the Council is the final step by which to establish this ZIP as a part of the City's Comprehensive Plan and provides the basis for increasing the impact fee. Once approved by the Council and once the time frame has run for the 2024 ordinance by which the impact fee is increased and the ordinance is in effect, this ZIP will be considered to have replaced the 2020-2025 ZIP adopted in 2019.

INTRODUCTION AND GENERAL COMMENTS (cont'd)

Carmel/Clay Board of Parks and Recreation and its Department ("CCPR")

In 1991, the City and Clay Township (the "Township") created the Carmel/Clay Board of Parks and Recreation (the "Park Board") by virtue of an agreement entitled "Park Joinder Under Interlocal Cooperation Act" and in 2002, continued and reformed the Park Board through an agreement entitled "Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Camel, Indiana and Clay Township of Hamilton County, Indiana (the "2002 Interlocal Agreement"), as has been and will continue to be, amended from time to time.

The Park Board is comprised of 9 appointed members based on their interest in and knowledge of parks and recreation. The City's Mayor and the Township's Trustee each appoint four members to staggered, four-year terms. The Carmel Clay School Board self-appoints one of its members to a one-year term. Current Park Board members and their appointing authority are listed below:

Judith F. Hagan, President Jenn Kristunas, Vice President Lin Zheng, Treasurer Linus Rude, Secretary Jonathan Blake Katie Browning James D. Garretson Joshua A. Kirsh Mark Westermeier

The Park Board is empowered to grow, administer and manage the Carmel Clay Park and Recreation System through the Carmel/Clay Park and Recreation Department ("CCPR"), all as set forth in the 2002 Interlocal Agreement.

CCPR has a legacy of providing high-quality parks and services to the Community. It manages and maintains more than 534 park acres and numerous recreation facilities, including the Monon Community Center and The Waterpark. In addition, CCPR partners with Carmel Clay Schools to manage Extended School Enrichment (ESE), a before and after-school care program for K-6 students located at all 11 Carmel elementary schools. The Summer Camp Series is a component of ESE that offers 12 different summer camps accommodating children ages 5-15.

CCPR has consistently been recognized as one of the best parks and recreation agencies in the United States winning the National Gold Medal Award for Excellence in Park and Recreation Management in 2014 and 2020. It is one of only 205 park and recreation systems in the United States currently accredited through the Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies, demonstrating compliance with national best practices. CCPR's summer camps are also nationally accredited by the American Camp Association. Other recent National Recreation and Park Association national awards include: 2018 National Distinguished Professional Award, 2016 Excellence in Inclusion Award and the 2015 Barb King National Environmental Stewardship Award. CCPR has a highly qualified staff and is dedicated to continuing education for its employees, as demonstrated by the number of certified professionals: 2 Certified Park & Recreation Executives, 5 Certified Park and Recreation Professionals, 4 Aquatic Facility Operators, 3 Certified Playground Safety Inspectors, 1 SHRM Senior Certified Professional, 2 SHRM Certified Professionals, and 1 Child and Youth Care Associate.

As an accredited agency, CCPR serves the recreation, fitness, and nature needs of the Community, manages and develops existing spaces and resources, and creates a sustainable future for parks and recreation programs through a financially viable and environmentally conscious parks system. It has caused the preparation of an updated 2024-2029 Parks and Recreation Master Plan (the "PRMP") and its components which includes this ZIP that evaluates the condition of existing park infrastructure and forecasts the capital budget necessary to replace facilities. While this ZIP is intended to be a standalone plan, it is supported by the information contained in the PRMP, which are incorporated herein by this reference.

INTRODUCTION AND GENERAL COMMENTS (cont'd)

The Council and the Township Board determine and provide revenue for the general fund operation of CCPR. Except as specifically provided herein, the Funding of CCPR and the description of the Carmel Clay Park and Recreation system is substantially similar to those descriptions provided in the 2020-2025 ZIP which is incorporated herein by this reference.

Summary of Impact Fee Calculation and Community Level of Service - Page 6

The 2024 Impact Fee calculation is based on the infrastructure information and infrastructure level of service standards compiled by the City, CCPR and their advisors, and was calculated based on an analysis of estimated recreation infrastructure needs over a 10-year planning horizon (2025-2034).

The schedule on page 6 illustrates the calculation of the proposed maximum 2024 Impact Fee at \$8,276 per housing unit. The costs to be funded through the 2024 Impact Fee are based on the estimated 2024 cost of infrastructure improvements to meet the calculated Community Level of Service, the quantitative measure of the service provided by the infrastructure determined to be appropriate.

The Impact Fee is not expected to be the sole source of revenue for parks and recreation improvements for the next 10 years. Credits and deductions reflect the estimated non-local revenue contribution to recreation capital projects, the contribution of new residents to principal payments on outstanding and proposed bonds, and the contribution of new residents to CCPR's annual capital projects budget through traditional means.

2024 Impact Fee Phase-In Schedule - Page 7

The CCPR has determined it will not charge the proposed maximum Impact Fee of \$8,276 as calculated on page 6. Instead, the CCPR is proposing a phased increase of the 2024 Impact Fee over the five-year effective period.

The schedule on page 7 illustrates the proposed phase-in schedule which applies a 10% annual increase beginning with the 2020 Impact Fee amount of \$4,882. The annual adjustments are assumed to be effective on January 1, 2025 based on an assumed Council approval in June 2024:

<u>Historical Population Housing Unit Growth 2015-2024 and Estimated Population and Housing Unit</u> Growth 2025-2034 – Page 8

The schedule on page 8 illustrates the City's historical population and housing units for the time period of 2015-2024, and the estimated population and housing units for 2025-2034. The population and housing unit information and estimates are per DOCS.

INTRODUCTION AND GENERAL COMMENTS (cont'd)

Current Level of Service "Current LOS" Calculation-Page 9

The Current Level of Service ("Current LOS") is the quantitative measure of service provided by existing infrastructure to support existing development. The City, the Township, the Park Board and CCPR continue to responsibly and appropriately invest in the Carmel Park and Recreation System, conservatively valued today at \$407,401,619. The 2004 \$55 Million Lease-Rental Bond (the "Central Park Bond") developed a large section of the 161 acre Central Park and its signature facility, the Monon Community Center. The Central Park Bond was refinanced in 2015 as the Carmel Clay Parks Building Corporation Lease Rental Refunding Bonds, Series 2015 A and Series 2015 B (collectively, the "2015 Bonds") to save taxpayer dollars. The Township's receipt of the Local Income Tax attributable to the property tax levy associated with 2015 Bonds returns more than \$2,000,000 per year and is required to be used on Park Capital Projects, though the 2015 Bonds will fully mature January 15, 2025. This commitment to identify, acquire and develop available parkland, maintain park infrastructure, seek input from current residents and strive to address in part with regularly updated impact fees, the park and recreational demands that new residents place on the Carmel Clay Park and Recreation System, is unwavering.

The schedule on page 9 illustrates the Current LOS calculation of \$9,401 per existing housing unit based on the sum of the estimated Land Value and estimated Improvement Value divided by the number of current housing units. The quality and condition of the Carmel Clay Park and Recreation System reflects the significant investment and high level of importance that the City, the Township, the Park Board and CCPR place on the quality of life.

Estimated 2025-2034 Infrastructure Costs to be Funded by Impact Fees - Page 10

This schedule on page 10 summarizes the estimated current infrastructure costs for the West Park, Bear Creek (Northwest) Park, the White River Corridor, the Central Core, the Chinese Garden, the Japanese Garden, and Thomas Marcuccilli Nature Park development areas by calculating the estimated cost of each amenity, including a 20% allowance for construction and design contingencies. The calculation considers infrastructure needs and demands from the estimated housing development and population growth, as illustrated in the PRMP. The total future estimated infrastructure costs are \$75,606,223. The estimated current infrastructure costs are per the PRMP.

Estimated 2025-2034 Infrastructure Development and Costs – Pages 11 – 17

These schedules on pages 11, 12 and 13 illustrate the estimated costs for the development of infrastructure in the each of the West Park, Bear Creek (Northwest) Park, the White River Corridor, the Central Core, the Chinese Garden, the Japanese Garden, and Thomas Marcuccilli Nature Park development areas. Cost estimates are per the PRMP.

Estimated Annual 2024 Impact Fee Revenues - Page 18

The schedule on page 18 shows the estimated annual revenues for the 2024 Impact Fee. The estimated revenues are calculated by multiplying the estimated housing units for each year by the 2024 Impact Fee per housing unit for each given year as outlined on Page 7. It is assumed that the base implementation calendar year for the 2024 Impact Fee will be 2025.

Estimated New Population Share of Principal Payments on Outstanding and Proposed Bonds – Page 19

The schedule on page 15 shows the calculation of the estimated share of the principal payments on the outstanding Clay Township General Obligation Bonds, Series 2019A through 2019L (the "2019 Bonds"), and the Clay Township General Obligation Bonds, Series 2022 (the "2022 Bonds"), and the principal that will be funded by new residents. The 2015 Bonds will fully mature on January 15, 2025.

INTRODUCTION AND GENERAL COMMENTS (cont'd)

Estimated New Population Share of Principal Payments on Outstanding and Proposed Bonds – Page 19 (Cont'd)

The 2019 Bonds are payable from ad valorem property taxes levied on all property located within Clay Township. During the 10-year planning horizon, the 2019 Bonds have \$19,330,000 of outstanding principal that will be paid down. The 2022 are payable from ad valorem property taxes levied on all property located within Clay Township. During the 10-year planning horizon, the 2022 Bonds have \$2,915,000 of outstanding principal that will be paid down.

It is assumed that new residents will pay a share proportional to their makeup of the total population of the City. Based on these assumptions, it is assumed that new residents will contribute \$1,525,840 to the principal payments on the 2019 Bonds and the 2022 Bonds made during the planning horizon of the ZIP. The ZIP makes no assumptions of future new money or refunding debt issuances by Clay Township or the City.

Estimated New Population Share of Capital Budget - Page 20

The schedule on page 16 shows the calculation of the estimated share of the Park Board's annual capital budget that will be funded by new residents. The annual Park Board capital budget is funded from sources including (but not limited to) Local Income Tax Certified Shares.

It is assumed that the historical average annual capital budget amount of \$2,864,000 will be held constant into the future, and new residents will pay a share proportional to their makeup of the total population of the City. Based on these assumptions, it is assumed that new residents will contribute 12.44% of the total capital projects budget in 2034, or \$2,156,010 over the entire 10-year planning horizon.

Estimated Annual 2024 Impact Fee Revenues and Expenditures - Page 21

The estimated annual revenues from the 2024 Impact Fee, the estimated new population's contribution to bond principal and the estimated new population's contribution to the capital budget are compared to the estimated expenditures of these revenues over the 10-year planning horizon in this schedule. The estimates are based on the accumulation of revenues and the estimated need for new infrastructure as dictated by population growth and the Community Level of Service standards. Due to the proposed phase-in of the 2024 Impact Fee, this schedule shows that the impact fee fund balance would not be able to fund all the needed infrastructure over the 10-year horizon. CCPR, together with the City and Clay Township, will continue to evaluate non-impact fee funding options for capital needs.

<u>Historical Recreation Infrastructure Improvements Expenditures Not Funded Through Recreation</u> Impact Fees, Donations or Debt – Page 22

The schedule on page 22 shows the historical capital expenditures for recreation from 2019 through 2023.

<u>Historical Impact Fee Receipts and Expenditures – Page 23</u>

The schedule on page 23 shows the receipts and expenditures for the recreation impact fees from calendar year 2014 through 2023. The Impact Fee revenues may be spent only on items identified in the capital improvements plan provided in the ZIP. Specific projects and infrastructure that Impact Fee revenues may be spent on are illustrated on pages 11-17. The Impact Fee fund balance as of December 30, 2023 is \$4,262,667.44 per CCPR. Impact fee credits granted to developers are not accounted for in this schedule.

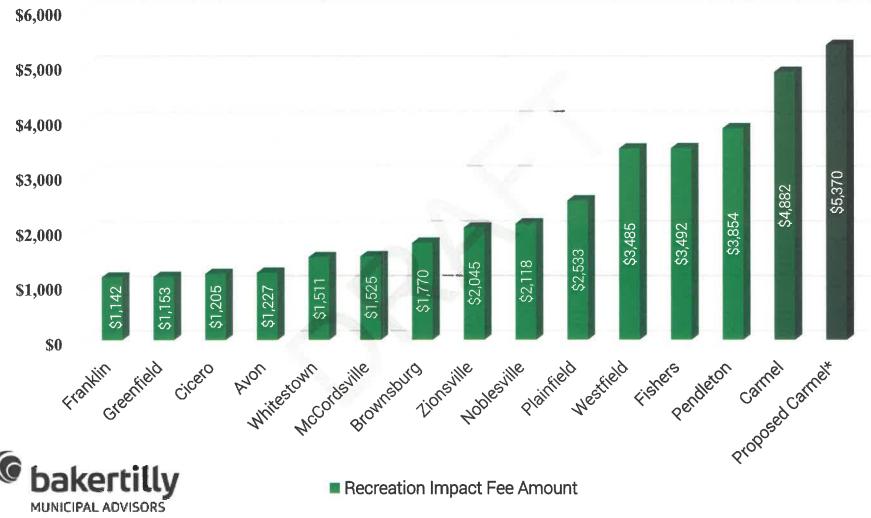
